Supporting the Durham Hospital in 2021



Foundation donors remained generous in 2021, showing their support for the Durham Hospital with gifts of their money and their time. Rather than allow external circumstances to affect them, they continued to support their hospital, close to their homes and hearts.

Thanks to donors, the Foundation made its final payment for the new ultrasound scanner. The Board paid \$166,000 for the ultrasound over two years.

The Foundation also provided \$42,000 for a new spirometry machine system. The Hospital needed to replace the booth, mouthpiece, stool, spirometry machine and computer. Replacing the respiratory

testing equipment will keep the Durham Hospital on the cutting edge with new technology and skilled staff. Last year, 744 respiratory tests were performed at the Durham Hospital. That is 3 tests each day the machine was in use!

The biggest investment the Foundation made to the Durham Hospital in 2021 was the new ED entrance. Thanks to funders such as FCC's AgriSpirit Fund, Canadian Medical Association Foundation, Bruce Power and Leslie Motors, \$156,000 was raised to fund a new ambulance entrance,

providing a safe and private entrance for critically ill or injured patients and a dignified exit for those who pass away while in hospital.

The Foundation and hospital staff thank you, the donors for your generosity. It is your commitment that keeps high quality health care here in Durham.

One of the biggest challenges ever faced by this Foundation is the need to recruit new family doctors for our community. As doctors retire and practices close, patients have been left with no primary care provider and their health can and does suffer.

This community is also experiencing growth- it is expected the population will grow by at least 50% in the next few years. Not only do present day area residents need a doctor, but so will all the families moving here.

The Physician Recruitment Committee has been working hard over the past six years to reach, steward and recruit new doctors. Members have attended recruitment events, hosted medical students and residents, advertised, created websites and work with other communities' recruiters. One of the biggest hurdles has been funding; funds for recruitment cannot be taken from fundraised revenue. Until recently, recruitment efforts have been funded from the profits of running the Medical Clinic and from donations specifically designated to recruitment, such as from the Municipality of West Grey.

The Durham Hospital Foundation received a gift of \$250,000 in 2021 designated to physician recruitment. Funds may be used for a variety of things such as advertising, travel, incentives, registration fees and hosting.

Richard Rooney (centre) and his family presented this generous gift to the Foundation to show their support for local health care and commitment to recruiting and retaining skilled doctors. Ultimately, the goal is to help ensure that residents and visitors have access



to the health care they need.

President and CEO of South Bruce Grey Health Centre- Michael Barrett



The resiliency and dedication of South Bruce Grey Health Centre's staff and physicians has been remarkable as the COVID-19 pandemic rolls into its third year. In the midst of adversity, the SBGHC team faced these challenges, and ensured that patients continue to receive the highest quality of care.

Most recently, the provincial health system has been challenged by a shortage of health human resources, including nursing and laboratory staff, and physicians. These shortages led to the difficult decision to reduce hours in the Chesley emergency department (ED) in 2019, and the Walkerton ED in 2021. We continue to work hard to ensure the Durham hospital has the qualified staff and physicians it requires.

SBGHC has created a Nursing Recruitment and Retention Action Plan to develop a strong team of nurses, which has allowed us to now reopen 24 hour service at the Walkerton ED, and plans to re-open 24 hour service in Chesley in mid-June. The Action Plan will also ensure that we can retain and recruit nurses at the Durham hospital as well.

During these challenging times, support from our communities has been a constant, and we are extremely grateful for this support. Support from the Durham Hospital Foundation was instrumental in the construction of a new ambulance entrance, which opened in November 2021, providing a better experience for patients arriving at the hospital in an emergency situation.

The Durham Hospital Foundation also supported the purchase of a new spirometry machine for our cardiorespiratory department - a critical piece of equipment used to diagnose breathing-related illness. The Foundation has also contributed to the replacement and upgrade of the hospital's telephone and overhead paging system, leading to an improved patient experience.

Please know that your gift to the Durham Hospital Foundation supports essential equipment for providing care. On behalf of SBGHC's Board of Directors, staff and physicians, I want to extend our sincere thanks for your support throughout 2021.
